Vishnupad Mandir History

Gaya derives from the fabulous demon Gayasur (which literally means Gaya the holy demon), demon (asur, a Sanskrit word) and Gaya. Over its record dating millennia, the word asur got deleted and the name Gaya remained in prevalence. Lord Vishnu kills Gayasur, the holy demon by using the force of his foot over him. This episode changed Gayasur into the sequence of rocky hills to create up the background of the Gaya city. Gaya was consequently blessed that he had the power to release the sins of individuals who touched him or looked at him; after his death lots of public have flocking to Gaya to perform shraddha sacrifices on his body to absolve the sins of their relatives. Gods and goddesses had assured to live on Gayasur's body after he died, and the hilltop protuberances of Gaya are surmounted by temples to different gods and goddesses. These hilltop temples at Rama Shila, Mangla Gauri, Shringa Sthan and Brahmayoni are part of the pilgrimage circuit, and magnificent staircases have been built up to most of them blessed places in Gaya correspond to physical features, most of which arise naturally. Ghats and temples line up the banks of the holy Falgu River. Trees such as pipal trees and Akshayavat, the undying banyan, are particularly sacred. The Mangla Gauri shrine is manifest by two rounded stones that represent the breasts of the mythological Sati, the first wife of Lord Shiva. At Present the most popular temple is Vishnu pad, a place along the Falgu River, manifest by a footstep of Vishnu incised into a wedge of basalt that specify the perform of Lord Vishnu subduing Gayasur by placing his foot on Gayasur's chest. The modern temple was rebuilt by Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar, the ruler of Indore, in the 18th century

Gaya is significant to Hindus from the point of outlook of deliverance to the souls of ancestors (a ritual called pindadanam). According to Ramayana, while Lord Rama arrive to Gaya along with Sita for pitrupaksha (or to perform pindadanam), Sita cursed the Falgu River following a few disobedience on the branch of the river. The ritual states that on account of this curse, Falgu River lost its water, and the river is simply a enormous stretch of sand dunes.

Vishnupad Temple situated in the central part of the older city is believed to have been built over the footprints of Lord Vishnu. within the temple, the 40 cm long 'footprint' of Vishnu is imprinted in concrete rock and surrounded by a silver plated basin. This Shikhara technique temple was build in 1787, by Queen Ahilya Bai of Indore, on the banks of the river Falgu. Non-Hindus are not permitted to go into the temple. A journey of 1000 stone steps leads to the top of the Brahmajuni Hill, 1 km south-west of the Vishnupad Temple that provide a wonderful outlook of the temple

The temple is yet a major pilgrim destination. The name of Gaya is based on the myth of demon Gayasur who Lord Vishnu had killed in a dual.

The place is so blessed for Hindus that even Lord Ram had performed Pindadanam here for his ancestors. Myth says that Lord Ram had come to Gaya to pay respect to his ancestors and Sita had accompanied him on his way.

Gaya is similarly significant for Buddhists as this was the place where Lord Buddha preached the Fire Sermon Adittapariyaya Sutta to around 1000 agriculture workers who were fire-worshippers. The influence of Buddha's conversation was so enormous that all of them changed to Buddhism.

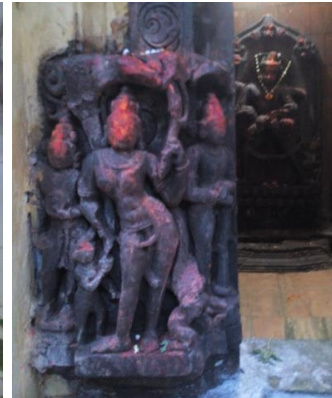
